Minutes of the Annual General Meeting 2022

It was proposed that the minutes of the 43nd AGM held on Wednesday 9th November 2022 were adopted and reflected a true record of the meeting.

Treasurer's Report

This is my fifth Annual report as your Treasurer and the fourth full accounting year in the role. The accounts prepared for this fiscal year continue to replicate a format that has been used for many years and affords comparisons to be made on both income and expenditure.

The three-year financial strategy was outlined at the 2021 AGM and this year has seen the second year of its implementation. The aim was to reduce an overall surplus of £1321.50 at the time by maintaining the current income model, increasing the prize money,including golf ball prizes, to equate to 75% of fee income and actively discussing with LGC appropriate projects which the Seniors Section could support. The Committee would also look to donate any further surpluses which arise to charity. It was calculated that these actions would reduce the surplus by around £600 over three years. We are on track to delivering this strategy.

In terms of income in 2022/23 subscription and competitions income are both strong. Donations plus tight monitoring of "Frog" contributors resulted in another healthy Captain's Charity collection. Payments and costs for the five Away Days were channelled through the Seniors Bank Account for ease of administration and these amounts cancel each other out.

Regarding expenditure, the Committee continued to recognise the excellent work of the Greens staff by an increased gratuity. Prizes paid out were 74% of entry fees, in line with the financial strategy. With regard to LGC, the sponsorship for the 12th tee is in the final year of a three-year deal. This deal has recently been renewed for another three years at the same cost. The Club logo sign for the halfway house was financed and erected. Other small LGC projects were supported, including the Golf-Fest and a donation to the Juniors.

It is recommended for 2023/24 that the Annual Subscription, competition entry fees, bereavement donations and all annual payments are unchanged.

Finally, my thanks go to my fellow Committee members for an excellent working relationship this year and to all Seniors for their support.

I should point out that the group emails from John and I are the only methods of advising you on what activities the Seniors Section are undertaking.

Intelligent Golf is now our Primary method of booking tees for a Monday, Wednesday and

Friday, albeit that for our Matches and Qualifying Competitions we have, with the cooperation of the office, secured pre booked slots.

Our matches for 2024 are secured and arranged and I hope that our selected teams continue with the success they achieved this year. On the subject of matches our thanks go out to Simon Morris who turned out for home matches to sort out the pre match coffees.

Roll ups on a Friday continue to be a challenge in regards to numbers, and make it very difficult for Derek Johnson and John Downs who volunteered to try to keep it up and running for us, as a weekly opportunity to play and enjoy the social activity of meeting up in the bar afterwards. Certainly numbers attending have been variable but last week showed a positive uptake.

There is little doubt that Covid and the introduction of Tee Booking has had a major impact on the approach of many of our Members. The long standing ethos under which Seniors happily turned out to play in roll ups early in the morning so that they had the afternoon free. This had the added benefit of providing the Club with more tee slots free for the late morning and early afternoon. Many Senior Members who pre Covid and Tee Booking, would faithfully turn out early, now take the opportunity to lie in and play their golf late morning or early afternoon, reducing the former tee availability benefit to the Club.

At the last AGM I advised that I intended to stand down as your Secretary at this AGM. Having held the post for 6 years, I can say that I thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to be your Secretary up to the sad day when Covid impacted upon how the Club, who in fairness to protect us all, had to change the way the day to day management of the Club was run. Since Covid trying to retain the ethos of the Section, without a return to pre Covid arrangements, has become a challenge for me, and I am afraid that I have lost too many discussions in regard to this to feel that I can successfully represent your interest and needs any longer.

All that said, I have many good memories. I thank you all for your support and hope that we continue to have a thriving Seniors Section within the Club for many years to come.
